

P226 Bible Curriculum

A Mission for Serving the Lord

Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he will not depart from it. **Proverbs 22:6**

P226 has a mission of building upon the conceptual trilogy of:

"Know" which immerses our children in the knowledge of God and His Word.

Deuteronomy 6: 5 - 9

"Grow" to develop a relationship with God and to obtain the goal of salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Acts 2:38 - 39

"Go" so as to enter the world with service and sharing of the Word and fulfill the Lord's mission as stated in Matthew 28:18 - 20.

Narratives

<u>12 – 24 months</u>

Provide for teachers the opportunity to set up learning activities based on toddler versions of favorite Bible stories, repetitive use of Christian words, Christian scripture in song Christian visuals and media. P226 helps young children learn while moving around, exploring, and playing. Learning activities follow three steps: Interactive Bible step with songs and videos, the Bible Review step inclusive of high repetition of Bible words, and the Craft step for tactile support of the stories and scripture. This is the experiential part of Know, Grow and Go as the foundational mission for the Pre – K through Grade 5 curriculum.

24-48 months (2 and 3 year old students)

P226 for preschoolers offers a curriculum that is alive with activity, creativity, and a focus on both Great Bible stories and a New Testament focus on Jesus. Lessons encourage scripture memorization through song, crafts, activities, video and storytelling. Children will learn Bible stories through interactive storytelling that articulates with the other instructional elements of the lessons.

4 & 5-year old students

Children will learn the chronology of the Old Testament Bible in P226 through: interactive storytelling, sing along to custom music that reinforces the stories and create craft projects with increased independence. In concert with the weekly Bible story students will engage in scripture memorization, activities that reinforce the lesson, video/media that coincide with the lesson and how to apply the story theme to their own lives.

Grades K & 1

P226 for Kindergarten and First graders provides this growing age-group an opportunity for increased independence and responsibility while meeting their capacity to grasp the love of God through biblical learning. Lessons are equipped to develop their increasing vocabulary and memorization ability, writing and drawing skills, and application of the truths within God's Word. This age group will engage in learning New Testament parables and journey through the Book of Acts.

Grades 2 & 3

P226 curriculum for second and third grades deepens students' Bible study skills and Scripture knowledge, expands their foundation of faith, offers real-life application while strengthening their Christian perspective of the world and how they fit in. The emphasis is on learning Bible stories in the Old Testament in second grade and continuing to stories in the New Testament. These two years are replete with a deeper study of the scripture through memorization and fun Bible based activities. Students new to the P226 program who may not have had the benefit of learning the foundational elements will be offered the "Recapture" aspect of P226. Recapture provides a review and greater depth of all elements of God's plan, the Old and New Testament stories previously taught and powerful scriptural memorization with application.

Grades 4 & 5

P226 will emerge with an articulated approach to teaching students how the Bible fits together historically, geographically and with a focus on the instrumental elements of worship. Scripture memorization and application will be emphasized along with the function and operation of the Church. Students will learn about the efficacy of prayer, the meaning of faith, the key points of salvation, the critical importance of worship and fellowship and a myriad of foundational knowledge that readies them to journey through the "Yellow Book" in preparation for eternal salvation. This is foundationally the beginning of the "Grow" cycle for our children.
