

The Sower

Jesus told parables. Very simply put, he had a way of telling a story that painted a picture in your mind. Sometimes he had to explain the meaning of the parable so that the listeners understood what he was saying in relation to glorifying God and obeying His word.

In this parable he told the crowd about a farmer who spread seed. Some fell on a pathway and birds came and ate it. Some fell on rocky soil and it sprang up quickly, but without a deep soil it withered in the sun and died. Other seed fell on soil with thorns and as the plant grew up the thorns overwhelmed them and choked them out. Finally, some seed fell on very good soil where it produced a crop 100, 60 or 30 times what was sown.

Later in verse 18 of chapter 13 of Matthew, Jesus explains what he told them.

“When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. ²⁰The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. ²¹But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. ²²The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. ²³But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.”

Scripture: Matthew 13 New International Version (NIV)

The Parable of the Sower

13 That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. ²Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. ³Then he told them many things in

parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. ⁴As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. ⁶But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. ⁷Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. ⁸Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. ⁹Whoever has ears, let them hear."

¹⁰The disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?"

¹¹He replied, "Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them. ¹²Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them. ¹³This is why I speak to them in parables:

"Though seeing, they do not see;
though hearing, they do not hear or understand.

¹⁴In them is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah:

"You will be ever hearing but never understanding;
you will be ever seeing but never perceiving.

¹⁵For this people's heart has become calloused;
they hardly hear with their ears,
and they have closed their eyes.

Otherwise they might see with their eyes,
hear with their ears,
understand with their hearts

and turn, and I would heal them.¹^[a]

¹⁶But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. ¹⁷For truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

¹⁸"Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: ¹⁹When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil

one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. ²⁰The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. ²¹But since they have no root, they last only a short time. Question Time:

- 1. When seeds are spread on the ground, what do we hope will happen?**
- 2. Should seeds be planted on any soil or is it best to be on good fertile soil?**
- 3. What happens to seeds on a pathway? On rocky soil? On thorny soil?**
- 4. Can you explain what Jesus meant in this parable?**

Next Steps: Try it out. Take some seeds that you buy at Lowes or Home Depot. Spread some on a pathway, some on rocky soil and some on thorny or weed covered soil. Then spread some on real good soil from a bag of Miracle Grow. See what happens.
