I Samuel 17 David and Goliath

Mr. Tim will be sitting in a chair outside next to the fake rock by the dog house. Will would be sitting on the fake rock. The camera will be on a tripod.

Mr. Tim – Welcome to Quarantine Bible Study. Today I am interviewing a famous Bible character named David. In I Samuel chapter 17 the story is told about a boy who is the youngest son of Jesse. We are going to speak with him about his confidence to take on the champion warrior for the Philistines named Goliath.

Mr. Tim – Good Morning David.

Will – Good morning Mr. Tim.

Mr. Tim – Thank you for agreeing to sit down for this Bible character interview.

Will - You are more than welcome.
