

DAYDREAMING

When's the last time you daydreamed? Yesterday? Last week? Have you allowed yourself to daydream in the last ten years? Maybe you haven't since you were a kid looking out the window of your classroom, fantasizing about the freedom that lay outside in waiting. I have a vivid memory from when I was eleven of staying the night at a friend's house. Long after he had gone to school, I was waiting on his dad to take me home. He was finishing some things around the house, and I was just sitting on their couch. He said, "Wow Brian, I don't think I've ever seen someone your age content to just sit." I was daydreaming.

I love my office. Partially because it has a huge window that lets me see the wood line and the church yard. I get all kinds of wildlife activity back there. It's beautiful. Did you know squirrels can bury up to 10,000 nuts in a single season? So if a squirrel lives to its full lifespan, in the wild about 10 years, they could bury upwards of 100,000 nuts or more! I see a lot of squirrels throughout the day. I wonder: Where do they go? What have they seen? What is the best tree for them? These simple daydreams are silly and pointless - except for one thing. They remind me that there are fingerprints of the Creator everywhere. Psalm 148 is too long to be written here, but go read it. I'll just reference verses 5 and 10 for now.

"Let them praise the name of the Lord! For he commanded and they were created... Beasts and all livestock, creeping things and flying birds!"

The Psalmist is imploring that we remember God and praise him, just as the squirrels do. Just like all of Creation.


Children are dropped off in rm 23 between 5:50-6:00 p.m. and picked up between 7:00-7:10 p.m.

Children must be signed in and out by a parent.


